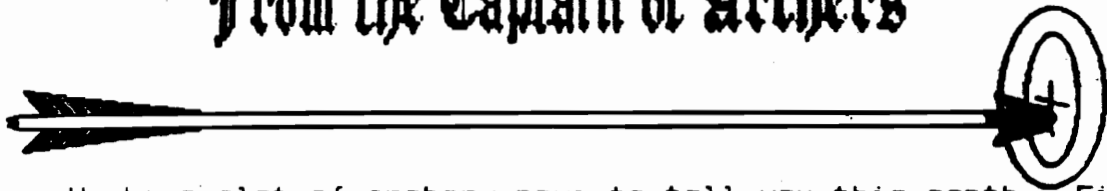


From the Captain of Archers
